

We have recently performed a long overdue maintenance of our plumbing system on our building, and with fingers crossed and a little extra sweat work from our maintenance associate, everything worked out great. Our main sewer lines are in good shape so for now we can avoid any necessary and costly repairs. The buildings are 40 years old and most of the piping is cast iron, but holding up well. All of the toilets in both buildings have been replaced, and a new clean-out has been installed for better maintenance needs in the future. New tile has been installed in the men's restroom where the clean-out was put in.

We have finally replaced the old worn out quad stack weight unit in the exercise room with a brand new piece. It is another 4-Stack Tower Combo unit which will hopefully be versatile enough to meet the needs of everyone. So far it seems to be enjoyed by those who have tried it out.

We have more future needs around the Clubhouse and grounds that will require a series of meetings to prioritize all of these necessary projects; anyone's input is more than welcome, just join in on one of the meetings. Soon we will have to replace the flat part of the Clubhouse building roof that houses the AC units. It will be one of the many bigger projects that we will have to face in the next few months.

Please enjoy spring, maybe perform a little clean up around your house and neighborhood to help make Summerlakes more enjoyable for all of us.

BRUSH PICK-UP BEGINS IN APRIL

Free brush pick-up resumes in April. Summerlakes falls within Zones 1 & 2. Please refer to the map below to find out what zone you live in:

Zone 1 - First Monday of April, May, September, and October

Zone 2 - Second Monday of April, May, September, and October


Please keep in mind that although brush is required to be set out by 7:00 a.m. on the designated Monday, pickup may occur on a day later in that week.

Brush piles must comply with the following:

- One pile per address
- Pile cannot be greater than 3 feet in height, 8 feet in depth, and 15 feet in length
- Branches cannot be longer than 8 feet in length and no more than 8 inches in diameter
- Branches must be placed with the larger cut end toward the street

Brush pick-up is limited to trimmings (not tree removal) from bushes or shrubs, and branches from trimming and/or pruning trees. Other items such as logs, root balls, stumps, lumber, etc. will **NOT** be picked up. **Brush piles that do not conform to these standards will not be picked up and a notice will be left on the front door.** Call the City Public Works Department at 630.393.9050 for


HELP WANTED - LIFEGUARDS
