Opossums and Ticks

A couple of weeks ago I was startled to see a possum waddling across my front lawn. Anyone who has ever met one will understand why I was startled; opossums are not the most attractive animals. They look particularly fierce when they feel threatened and hiss. Despite their intimidating appearance and manner they are quite shy and rarely carry any disease. They usually will play dead if they can not run away, and they would happily move into a crawl space or shed if given the opportunity. They are particularly fond of pet food, or any sort of food scraps so please do not leave anything out to tempt them. They are also fond of eating slugs and they particularly like ticks which brings me to the next thing. (www.extension.illinois.edu/Ode to the Opossum)



April, May and June are the peak season for ticks in this area and there are several varieties of disease carrying ticks found in northern Illinois. This year a new type, the Lone Star Tick which carries the Heartland virus, (www.cdc.gov/stari/disease/) has been reported moving this way. After spending time outside this spring and summer it is important to check yourself, children and pets for these little pests. They like to burrow into the skin, particularly near hair lines, and need to be carefully removed (www.cdc.gov/ticks/removing_a_tick).

Remember, any tick a possum eats is a tick that will not be biting you or anyone else.

CITY BRUSH PICK-UP BEGINS IN APRIL

Free brush pick-up for this year will begin in April. Summerlakes falls within Zones 1* & 2*.

Zone 1 - First Monday of April & May *(North of Batavia Road)

Zone 2 - Second Monday of April & May *(South of Batavia Road)

Please keep in mind that although brush is required to be set out by 7:00 a.m. on the designated Monday, pickup may occur on a day later in that week.

Brush piles must comply with the following guidelines:

- One pile per address
- Pile cannot be greater than 3 feet in height, 8 feet in depth, and 15 feet in length
- Branches cannot be longer that 8 feet in length and no more than 8 inches in diameter
- Branches must be placed with the larger cut end toward the street

Brush piles that do not conform to these standards will not be picked up and a notice will be left on the front door. Call the City Public Works Department at 630.393.9050 for more information.

SUMMERLAKES HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATION BOARD MEETING March 10, 2022

Meeting was called to order by President Steve Lewis at 6:58 pm. Present: Steve Lewis, Harlan (Nick) Davis; Fred Baker; Megan Kleiber; Pam Watts; Mike Dobosiewicz; and Jeanne Tassotto

Homeowners Present: Kirsten Davis; Dave Alder; Trisha Spicer; Brad Spicer;

Guest: Mike Butkovich from Just in Time Pool Service

Homeowner Comments: None

Board Comments: Steve Lewis made a **motion** to make masks optional. Motion seconded by Harlan (Nick) Davis. Motion carried.

Pool Presentation: Mike Butkovich from Just in Time Pool Service gave us an update on the condition of our pool and outlined what will be needed to open this spring. The pump deteriorated too much to be rebuilt and will need to be replaced. If the pump is replaced by exactly the same type of unit we will not need a permit and will be able to open on time. If we use a different type of pump a permit will be required which will significantly delay opening.

Secretary Report: Minutes for the February meeting were submitted for approval. Mike Dobosiewicz moved to approve as read. Harlan (Nick) Davis seconded. **Motion** carried.

Financial Report: The Profit and Loss statement was submitted for approval. Harlan (Nick) Davis moved to approve as read. Jeanne Tassotto seconded. **Motion** carried.

New Business:

Playground Upgrades - various options concerning equipment and ground coverings were discussed. Kirsten Davis, who has offered to work on this project, estimated that the playgrounds will cost \$40,000 to \$90,000 each.

Pool - A **motion** was made by Fred Baker, and seconded by Jeanne Tassotto to spend up to \$20,000 to replace the pool pump. Motion carried.

Achitectural Meeting Report: Steve Lewis reported that we need to purchase a new shop vac which can be purchased from petty cash. The doors to the storage area in the party building were damaged and will need to be repaired. This can be done in-house.

Motion to adjourn to Executive Session made by Harlan (Nick) Davis, seconded by Jeanne Tassotto. Motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at 8:12 pm. Executive Session called to discuss personnel matters.
