SUMMERLAKES HOMEOWNERS' BOARD MEETING

July 14, 2022

Meeting called to order at 7:02pm.

<u>BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT</u>: Steve Lewis; Harlan (Nick) Davis; Fred Baker; Jeanne Tassotto; Megan Kleiber. Absent: Mike Dobosiewicz and Pam Watts. Also present: Mickie Speedy and Paul Ochmanek, representing our legal firm.

<u>HOMEOWNER COMMENTS</u>: Various residents spoke concerning a variety of issues including: misinformation being posted on Facebook; abuse of front desk staff by residents and guests; lack of parental supervision particularly of young children at pool; lack of proper maintenance by a homeowner including improper disposal of trash.

BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS: Board members and attorney commented on issues and indicated how each would be addressed.

SECRETARY REPORT: Minutes were submitted and approved.

<u>FINANCIAL REPORT</u>: Financial states were submitted for approval. Harlan (Nick) Davis motioned to approve, seconded by Jeanne Tassotto - Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

<u>DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS</u>: Paul Ochmanek, from KSN (our legal firm) spoke on our options for collecting delinquent accounts, particular the few who are most in arrears and who have been uncooperative about remedying the situation. He particularly covered SHA's options in pursuing evictions. This matter will be discussed further in Executive Session.

<u>COMPUTER SYSTEMS</u>: Most of the on-going problems (syncing both computers, updating operating systems etc) have been addressed, the remaining issues will be worked on and if needed an outside consultant will be contacted.

<u>POOL</u>: Bids are being collected. Preliminary estimates are in the \$800,000 to \$1,000,000 range for permits, demolition, construction of pool, play area and concrete apron. The timeline estimate is: planning and permits 2022-early 2023; demolition and construction 2023; reopening in 2024.

<u>CEILING IN SPA AND EXERCISE AREA OF CLUBHOUSE</u>: Preliminary estimate is \$35,000 for refinishing these wood ceilings including any mold remediation needed, replacement of damaged wood by a licensed contractor supplying all needed scaffolding.

<u>PLAYGROUND</u>: A survey of three options each for Continental and Cynthia parks has been prepared and will be available at the picnic. It will also be sent out in a community wide mailing.

<u>PICNIC</u>: The food trucks, band and children's play area have all been booked and confirmed. Items have been collected for the raffle.

NEW BUSINESS:

CLUBHOUSE RULES: All residents being issued new ID's will be presented with a copy of rules for Clubhouse and pool.

ARCHITECTURE AND MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE REPORT:

Bank stabilization along southern bank has been completed with planting

Bridge has been inspected. The preliminary report is that it is basically sound but needs some repair and work to bring up to current code requirements. The final report will be delivered soon.

A motion to adjourn was made by Jeanne Tassotto, seconded by Harlan Davis. Motion carried and meeting was adjourned to Executive Session at 8:45 pm.
