CITY BRUSH PICK-UP FOR SEPTEMBER & OCTOBER

Free brush pick-up will resume in September & October. Summerlakes falls within Zones 1* & 2*.

Zone 1 - First Monday of September & October *(North of Batavia Road)

Zone 2 - Second Monday of September & October *(South of Batavia Road)

Please keep in mind that although brush is required to be set out by 7:00 a.m. on the designated Monday, pickup may occur on a day later in that week.

Brush piles must comply with the following guidelines:

- One pile per address
- Pile cannot be greater than 3 feet in height, 8 feet in depth, and 15 feet in length
- Branches cannot be longer that 8 feet in length and no more than 8 inches in diameter
- Branches must be placed with the larger cut end toward the street

Brush piles that do not conform to these standards will not be picked up and a notice will be left on the front door. Call the City Public Works Department at 630.393.9050 for more information.

CONTINENTAL POND

Last fall a culvert carrying storm water into Continental Pond collapsed creating a large open hole near the pond bank. This was brought to the attention of the City who acknowledged that it was their responsibility to repair this but they would not be able to until spring at the earliest. The area was blocked off and we waited until this project was completed before we could proceed with other work planned for this area. The City finally replaced the broken drainage pipe and repaired the damaged landscaping. We are now ready to move on with the additional items on our to-do list.

SUMMERLAKES HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATION August 11, 2022

Meeting called to order at 7:04 pm.

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT: Steve Lewis; Megan Kleiber; Fred Baker; Pam Watts; Jeanne Tassotto. Also present: Mickie Speedy. Absent: Harlan (Nick) Davis.

HOMEOWNERS/RESIDENTS PRESENT: Kirstin Davis; Lisa Tassotto; Monica Lingafelter; Rachel Kay; Kourtney and Andrew Weidemiller.

HOMEOWNER COMMENTS: Questions were raised about the funds allocated for the playgrounds.

SECRETARY REPORT: Motion was made to accept the July minutes as submitted. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Megan Kleiber asked about the \$1200 allocated and not used to purchase a pig for the Picnic. Mickie Speedy reported that it had been used to offset other expenses for this event.

Pam Watts asked about the second electrical charge on the Profit and Loss statement. It was explained that the billing cycles for the electric service (and other recurring bills) do not always coincide with our bookkeeping cycles. Occasionally there will be two charges posted in one month and no charges in the month proceeding or following.

Jeanne Tassotto motioned to approve the financial reports as submitted, seconded by Megan Kleiber. Motion carried.

COMPUTER: Fred Baker reported that he has gotten WiFi into Mickie's office but has not been able to get it through the building. Also there are still difficulties accessing Quick Books.

OLD BUSINESS:

CEILING IN CLUBHOUSE: Steve Lewis reported that we have only one bidder for this work so far. *Motion* was made to table this matter until September.

PLAYGROUNDS: Votes for new playground equipment have been counted and units selected. \$70,000 per playground has been allocated with the stipulation that monkey bars be added to each unit. *Motion* to approve made by Jeanne Tassotto, seconded by Fred Baker. Motion carried.

CLUBHOUSE ACCESS: Steve Lewis has met with City and gotten approval for the addition of a stroller accessible sidewalk into the upper level of the Clubhouse. This will also require the addition of a railing. While the concrete workers are on site broken concrete on the entrance sidewalk will be replaced. Megan Kleiber *motioned* to approve \$7500 for this work, Fred Baker seconded. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

ID MACHINE: Mickie Speedy reported that she has issued a couple hundred new or replacement ID's this summer which takes a large amount of staff time to process due to the outdated system and equipment. Mickie was requested to get information on updated equipment to improve current system for the September meeting.

BOARD VACANCY: Mike Dobosiewicz has resigned. His seat will be filled in the November election.

ELECTION TIMELINE: Candidate forms will be mailed out in early September and need to be returned by October 6th.

MOVIE NIGHT: An outdoor movie night for September 23rd (first day of Autumn) has been planned. Details will be in September newsletter.

SURVEYS FOR PICNIC: Megan Kleiber reported that there were requests for more games and activities for older kids and that we serve roast pig.

ARCHITECTURE AND MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE REPORT:

BANK STABILIZATION: Steve Lewis reported that:

The City has inspected and is satisfied with the work done so far.

Our landscaper has agreed to replace plants that did not take.

We still owe the homeowners who had their property damaged due to this project replacement junipers. Steve said he will get these when the plants become available in a few weeks.

BRIDGE: The bridge has been inspected and is solid. It does need some repair and maintenance work as well as some modifications to meet current code.

PLANTINGS: A few Rose of Sharon plants have been added.

Motion to adjourn was made by Fred Baker, seconded by Jeanne Tassotto. Meeting adjourned at 8:37pm.
